Directions

From Interstate 89:

- * Exit 11 for Richmond.
- * Take US Route 2 east to town of Richmond.
- * At traffic light, turn right onto Bridge Street.
- * Bridge St becomes Huntington Rd. Follow this road for about 5 miles.
- * Turn right onto Sherman Hollow Road (there are also signs for Birds of Vermont Museum and Green Mountain Audubon Nature Center).
- * Sleepy Hollow is 1.8 miles up Sherman Hollow Road on the left.

From Hinesburg (Rt. 116)

- * Take Mechanicsville Rd. (or CVU road) to Richmond-Hinesburg Rd., follow ~ 2.5 miles
- * Go right on Magee Hill Rd.(this is a dirt road)
- * Magee Hill joins Sherman Hollow Rd. at 1 mile, follow Sherman Hollow 2.5 miles to Sleepy Hollow, which is on the right.
